DOW JONES BEST-IN-CLASS WORLD AND EUROPE INDICES: MONCLER GROUP TOPS THE TEXTILES, APPAREL & LUXURY GOODS INDUSTRY FOR THE SEVENTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR

Milan, 4 May 2026 – For the seventh consecutive year, Moncler Group is confirmed in the Dow Jones Best-in-Class World and Europe Indices, maintaining the highest score (91/100) within the ‘Textiles, Apparel & Luxury Goods’ sector in the S&P Global Corporate Sustainability Assessment, as of March 23rd, 2026.

The Dow Jones Best-in-Class Index is a gold standard for corporate sustainability at a worldwide level and a trusted reference standard for investors who include sustainability considerations in the decision-making process of their investments. The index includes the leading sustainability-driven companies based on economic, environmental and social responsibility criteria, which are analyzed by S&P Global, one of the world’s foremost providers of credit ratings, benchmarks and analytics who conducts the assessment of more than 9,200 companies.

“Being included in the Dow Jones Sustainability World and Europe Best-in-Class Indices for the seventh consecutive year, and achieving the highest score in our sector, is a recognition that fills us with pride while reinforcing our sense of responsibility in the way we do business.

Key achievements in 2025

- >55% of yarns and fabrics used in 2025 collections made with “preferred”¹ materials (>43% in 2024);
- >60% of nylon used in 2025 collections coming from recycled materials (>50% in 2024);
- >55% of cotton used in 2025 collections coming from organic or recycled materials (~37% in 2024);
- Key suppliers² engaged in an awareness program to promote supply chain decarbonization, with 30% of them supported in the definition of their own emissions reduction plan;
- -46% in scope 1 and 2 CO₂e absolute emissions vs 2021³ ;
- 100% of electricity used at own directly operated corporate sites worldwide (production sites, offices, logistic hub and stores) from renewable sources since 2023;
- 71% of women in total Group workforce and 53% of women in management⁴;
- EDGE Certification for equal pay between women and men obtained for the Moncler brand at global level;
- >163,000 people most in need protected from the cold over the last five years.

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The Group's commitment continues with the SIDE by SIDE Sustainability Plan, which is guided by the belief that great ambitions can only be achieved through a collective effort involving the company and its people, the supply chain, and institutions. Among its various commitments, the Group reaffirms its objective to further reduce CO₂ emissions both at directly managed corporate sites and across the supply chain, to increase the use of lower-impact fabrics and yarns compared to conventional solutions (by 2028: $\geq 70\%$ recycled nylon, $\geq 65\%$ organic or recycled cotton, $\geq 75\%$ wool certified under specific standards), to implement programmes to strengthen social standards across the supply chain, and to support local communities through dedicated projects to protect people in need from the cold ($\geq 150,000$ over the three-year period 2026–2028).
